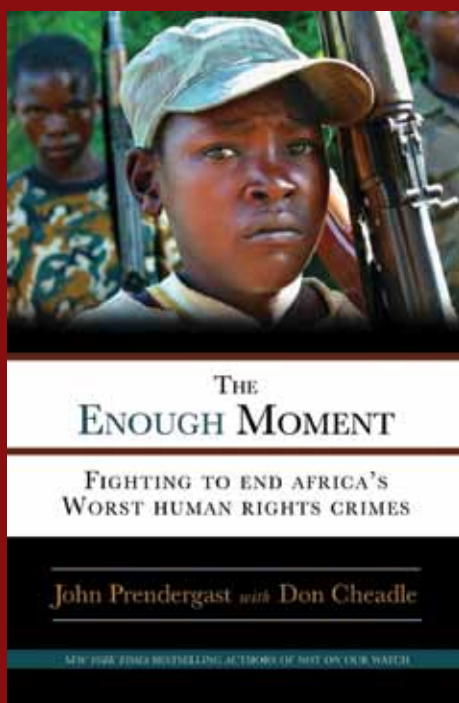
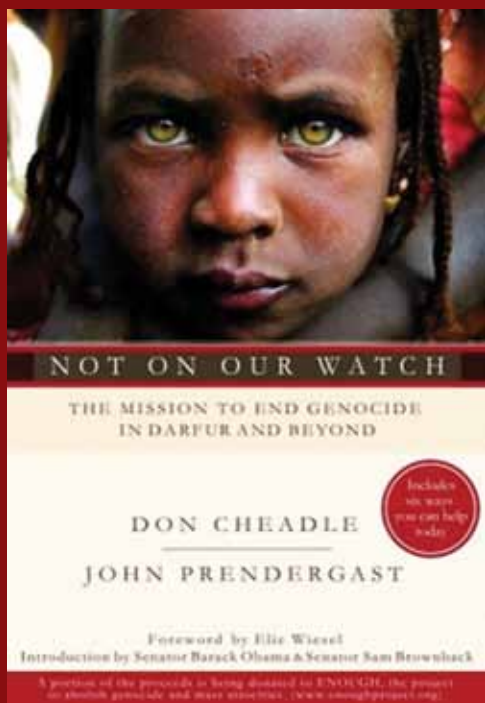

John Prendergast is Senior Advisor to the International Crisis Group and Co-Founder of the ENOUGH Campaign ([www.enoughproject.org](http://www.enoughproject.org)). Previously John worked at the White House and State Department during the Clinton administration, where he was involved in a number of peace processes throughout Africa. John has also worked for members of Congress, the United Nations, human rights organizations, and think tanks. He has authored 10 books on Africa, including *Not On Our Watch: The Mission to End Genocide in Darfur and Beyond*, a New York Times bestseller and NAACP non-fiction book of the year, which he co-authored with actor Don Cheadle. John recently released *The Enough Moment: Fighting to End Africa's Worst Human Rights Crimes*, also co-authored with Don Cheadle, which focuses on building a popular movement against genocide and other human rights crimes. John travels regularly to Africa's war zones on fact-finding missions, peace-making initiatives, and awareness-raising trips involving network news programs, celebrities, and politicians.
